	11.15 - 12.00	Romanian students are interpreting a traditional song, called "Doina", which is on the World Heritage list, from 2009. Romanian students are having, in front of all partners, a traditional costumes parade, with very old clothes handmade.

	15.10 - 16.00	Students are presenting their own PPT-s about their famous national painters and their famous paintings.
	15.10 - 16.00	Teachers are having a management meeting, about: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. the fulfilled tasks and activities, from September 2019 to February 2020; problems encountered; b. work on project development and on future activities; c. the next transnational students exchange, in Latvia.

	16.00 - 17.00	Students are learning a traditional Romanian song. They will sing, in front of their teachers, in a multinational choir, under a Romanian teacher's supervision.

Tuesday, 03.03.2020	8.00 - 12.00	Visiting Golești Village Museum, in order to find out about Romanian traditional and old houses architecture.
	13.30 - 14.30	Lunch (in Târgoviște)
	15.00 - 16.00	City walk tour, in order to have an experiential learning, for teachers and students, in Romanian cultural heritage, discovering the most important historical landmark of the city: Royal Medieval Court, with Chindia Tower. Teachers and students will have the chance to discover traditional blouse sewing and a very old and important collection of traditional Romanian clothes.

	17.15	Romanian students are offering a concert.

Wednesday, 04.03.2020	8.00 - 13.00	Cultural trip to Brașov, one of the ancient Romanian cities, settled along one of the oldest trade routes between Wallachia, Moldavia and Transylvania. Discovering lots of cultural heritages. Visiting Bran Castel, a medieval historical national monument and landmark in Romania. The fortress is on the Transylvanian side of the historical border with Wallachia, with a famous legend.

	15.00 - 16.30	Visiting Black Church, a very important monument created by the Transylvanian Saxons in the Medieval Age. Visiting other important monuments in Brașov.

	11.00 - 12.00	Teachers and students are participating in a workshop, in “Valachia” University, with a University History professor dr., about cultural heritage. Teachers and students are visiting the university.

	15.00 - 15.30	Students are presenting their old, traditional instruments (if it has been possible to bring them along).
	15.30 - 15.45	Romanian students are presenting old, traditional instruments and their Music teachers are explaining how these instruments work.
	15.45 - 16.00	Romanian students are offering a concert, with traditional instruments.
	16.00 - 16.30	Certificates of attendance and Europasses. Evaluation sheets. Reflection sheets.
	19.30	Farewell dinner
06.03.2020	8.00	Teachers and students are having a cultural trip to Bucharest, the capital of Romania, in order to learn about Romanian music and art heritages. Teachers and students will have a basic knowledge of Romanian music and art tradition.
	10.00 - 11.30	Visiting “The Old Villages Museum”, in order to discover a collection of textiles, icons, ceramics and other artifacts of Romanian old peasant life.
	12.00 - 13.00	Visiting National Art Museum, which is the country’s prime holder of Romanian, European and Oriental art. Apart from numerous temporary exhibitions, students can also discover the former Throne Hall and other spaces of historical relevance.
