

Swimming

• In Latvia there are 59 indoor swimming pools.


Open water swimming is only available in summer if the weather is warm enough.

• Each year there are at least different 100 swimming competitions in Latvia.

• Olaine swimming pool is available for everyone.

- Water temperature : + 28 C.
- The tracks are 25m long.

• The swimming pool is free for students during Sports lessons.

Students learn how to swim there.

• In the summer period the swimming pool is closed.




Emīls Pauls Mortuzāns


Our school is proud of Emīls Pauls Mortuzāns, a student of Form 9.

Water polo


• The Latvian water polo history began in 1930ies. There used to be several water polo clubs in that time.

• It is believed that since 1967 water polo did not exist in Latvia until 2011.

- In 2013 a junior water polo team was established.

Canoeing

- The first canoe club in Latvia was established in 1872.
- In 1927 the first international canoe competiton 'Riga Pokal' was organised in the Lielupe river.
- In 1990 Latvian Canoe Federation was taken into the International Canoe Federation.
- In 1991 Latvia started to take part into the World championships and Olympic games as independent country.

In Rio de Janeiro summer Olympic games in 2016 the canoe-paddler Aleksejs Rumjancevs has got the 5th place in 200 metres distance.



Ivans Klementjevs



The best Latvian canoe performer - Ivans Klementjevs.

From 1985- 1994 he became the world champion in canoe single distance in the post USSR team.

As a representative of a Latvian team Ivans Klementjevs won a silver medal in 1000 m distance in summer Olympic games in Barcelona in 1992 and in summer Olympic games in Atlanta in 1996.

Windsurfing

Windsurfing. Kitesurfing.

- Windsurfing and kitesurfing became popular during last 10-15 years in Latvia.
- It is rather complicated to train in windsurfing and kitesurfing in Latvia because of the weather and wind.
- Windsurfing and kitesurfing also include wind hunting because the wind blows in all directions depending on the season.
- Fans of these kinds of sports began their day by studying the wind prognosis for a day.





- Ice fishing is very popular seasonal sport and activity in winter.
- The officially ice fishing season begins on December 1st, but it depends on the thickness of the ice.

• Ice fishing competitions are organised each winter when the ice is strong enough.

• Latvian team won silver medals in the Baltezers World Championship in 2017.
